



Logbook Policies

Maintaining a logbook is an important part of the inventing process. **Therefore, a logbook will be a required part of the judging process.**

The logbook is a written record of the process of creating the invention. **This should be written as the inventing process is going on and not compiled after the process is complete.**

The logbook should address each of the Stages of Invention.

- Identifying the Problem
- Understanding the Goal
- Identifying a Solution
- Designing a Solution
- Building a Device
- Testing & Evaluating the Device
- Communicating the Results

The logbook can contain more information and sections, but as a minimum, it should contain sections for each of the Stages of Invention.

The logbook does NOT have to be in any style or format.

The information can be entered into a premade template or a blank notebook that is filled in during the invention process.

Attached is a copy of the Invention Convention Worldwide logbook template, which can be used as a model. **The purpose of the template is to guide the student through the steps in each of the Stages of Invention.**

There are some extra sections in this template, in addition to the Stages of Invention. **These extra sections can be deleted if desired.**

Affiliates are free to add their own logos to the template, but they should not remove the Invention Convention Worldwide logo. **Affiliates are also free to add color, pictures, and formatting changes to the template, but the Stages of Invention should remain the same.**

The logbook is a living document that reflects the actual work of the inventor as it occurs. **It does NOT have to be perfectly written, drawn, and spelled. Sloppiness and errors should be avoided, but they are not fatal flaws.**

The inventing process takes time, thought, and effort, and the concept of completing an invention logbook as they go through the process may be new and somewhat difficult for some students. **Therefore, students should be given the logbook template and its purpose explained when the invention program is first introduced.**

The students' logbook entries should be monitored by the teacher and used to gauge the students' inventing progress and assist them as needed.
